CONTRACT AWARDS

Contract No. 24-PW1 Operations Building Solar Panels

Prior to the bid opening, two contractors requested proposal bid forms. Bid proposals were received from two contractors for Contract No. 24-PW1- Public Works Operations Building Solar Panels with bid amounts as follows:

CONTRACTOR	BASE BID AMOUNT
Energy Independent Solutions, LLC	\$70,700.00
Hranec Sheet Metal, Inc.	\$130,000.00

Based on the bids submitted, LSSE suggests the award of the Base Bid of Contract No. 24-PW1, to EIS as low bidder in the amount of \$70,700.00, subject to EIS obtaining the required insurance certificates, performance bond, and payment bond.

The Borough received a Commonwealth Financing Authority Local Share Account - Statewide grant for the project in the amount of \$51,500.00.

The remaining \$19,200 for the project will come from the Public Works Capital Fund.

Motion to [award, deny, award with conditions] the Base Bid for Contract No. 24-PW1, Public Works Operations Building Solar Panels to the low bidder, Energy Independent Solutions, LLC, at a cost of \$70,700.00.

The Public Safety Assistance Committee met on Wednesday, May 15, 2024. Betsy Monroe will summarize.

Facilitating Emergency Response to Residences Guidelines

The Public Safety Assistance Committee recommends to Borough Council that the Borough follow the following guidelines when evaluating the public safety concerns for addresses in the Borough:

1. Addresses must match access: driveway access will dictate the road for the address.
2. Address numbers will follow in sequence with odd and even numbers on opposite sides.
3. Shared driveways with two through four houses will have Fox Chapel number signage.
4. Private drives with new road names will be created for shared driveways with more than four houses.

Borough staff will make their best effort to identify solutions that resolve public safety concerns with the minimum impact on homeowners.

***Motion to** [ratify, deny, or ratify with conditions] the payment of bills for April 2024 General Fund Vouchers 4763 - 4866 in the amount of \$1,008,941.43.*

SALE OF EQUIPMENT

Municibid - 2012 Ford F350 Super Duty Crew Cab

Bids were received on Municibid for the 2012 Ford F350 Super Duty Crew Cab. It is recommended to award the sale of the 2012 truck to the high bidder, Jason McMaster for \$18,000.

***Motion to** [award, deny, award with conditions] the sale of the 2012 Ford F350 Super Duty Crew Cab to Jason McMaster in the amount of \$18,000.*

NEW BUSINESS

Foxwall EMS Request for Supplemental Funding

Request from Foxwall EMS for supplemental funding in Budget Year 2024, of \$100,000. The pro rata share for the Borough of Fox Chapel is 60%, and Aspinwall Borough is 40%. This request is to bolster salaries and employee retention. The Borough portion is \$60,000. Foxwall asks that this \$100,000 increase be on an annual continuing basis.

A second request is for the purchase of a new ambulance in the amount of \$322,000. The Borough portion would be \$193,200. Aspinwall Borough has requested that the Borough of Fox Chapel

temporarily contribute \$64,400, a portion of Aspinwall's share. Aspinwall will reimburse Fox Chapel by March 2025. Resolution No. 692 and the agreement between Fox Chapel and Aspinwall Borough address this request. This is a one-time request for 2024.

Motion to [approve, deny, or approve with conditions] the request from Foxwall EMS for supplemental funding of \$60,000 to bolster salaries and employee retention, conditioned on Aspinwall's funding its 40% share of such supplemental funding (equal to \$40,000). Contingent upon the future responsibility and oversight for the accounts payable of Foxwall being assumed by Fox Chapel and Aspinwall Boroughs.

Motion to [approve, deny, or approve with conditions] the request for the purchase of a new ambulance with the Borough's contribution of \$193,200, conditioned on Aspinwall's funding its 40% share of such purchase (equal to \$128,000), as referenced in Resolution No. 692.

Resolution No. 692

Motion to [adopt, deny, or adopt with conditions] Resolution No. 692 authorizing the Borough of Fox Chapel to enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement with the Borough of Aspinwall to contribute Borough funds to Foxwall Emergency Medical Service, Inc. for the purchase of a new ambulance and to establish the repayment terms for a \$64,400 loan to the Borough of Aspinwall by the Borough of Fox Chapel.

Ordinance 729 Amending Section 338.13A, Stop Intersections Established, of the Code of the Borough
The Allegheny County Public Works Department will place a stop sign on Fox Chapel Road at Powers Run Road in the north direction to alleviate concerns regarding safety. The Borough Manager requested a traffic study for this intersection by PennDOT and Allegheny County after receiving requests from residents.

Motion to [enact, deny, enact with conditions] Ordinance No. 729, amending Section 338.13A, Stop Intersections Established, of the Code of the Borough by adding a stop sign on Fox Chapel Road at Powers Run Road in the north direction.

Ordinance 730 Establishing the sewer rates for Allegheny Valley Joint Sewage Authority
AVJSA Plant Manager, Timothy Kephart, provided a letter to the Borough of Fox Chapel alerting them to the rate increase due to the mandated plant expansion and conveyance system upgrade project. The rate increase is effective immediately at \$12.20 per 1000 gallons for water usage.

Motion to [enact, deny, or enact with conditions] Ordinance No. 730 establishing the sewer rates for Allegheny Joint Sewage Authority (AVJSA) and restating Borough, Harmar, and Allegheny County Sanitary Authority (ALCOSAN) rates.

Investment Policy Statement for the Borough of Fox Chapel Non-Uniform and Police Pension Plans
It is recommended by the Finance Committee to ratify the revisions of the August 8, 2011, Investment Policy Statement which outlines the objectives for Guyasuta Investors.

Motion to [ratify, deny, or ratify with conditions] the Investment Policy Statement for the Borough of Fox Chapel Non-Uniform and Police Pension Plans.

North Hills Council of Governments: Engagement to Perform Verizon Cable Franchise Renewal Services

The Cohen Law Group submitted a proposal for legal services to assist the eligible municipalities of the NHCOC in a franchise fee audit and cable franchise renewal negotiations with Verizon of Pennsylvania, Inc., due to the cable franchise agreements for these municipalities being set to expire towards the end of next year.

Motion to [accept, deny, or accept with conditions] the engagement of services of The Cohen Law Group to assist in a franchise fee audit and cable franchise renewal negotiations with Verizon of Pennsylvania, Inc. The fee for these legal services will be \$9,400 prior to the COG discounted fee based off of how many municipalities participate.

In accordance with the Advertisement, sealed bids for the subject contract were received through the Quest Construction Data Network (QuestCDN) until 11:00 AM on April 18, 2024. The bids received were opened and read aloud. There were three addenda issued for this contract.

Prior to the bid opening, two contractors requested proposal bid forms. Bid proposals were received from two contractors for Contract No. 24-PW1 - Public Works Operations Building Solar Panels with bid amounts as follows:

Per the Instructions to Bidders, bid bond companies were checked and all are listed on the U.S. Treasury Circular 570.

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EIS provided a note on the proposal acknowledgment indicating a completion time of one hundred twenty (120) calendar days from the date of utility approval (DLC approval of interconnection agreement). LSSE does not have an objection of the request. The formal notice to proceed, if awarded, can be dated when DLC approves the interconnection agreement which would then allow to contractor to start work.

The Borough received a Commonwealth Financing Authority Local Share Account – Statewide grant for the subject project in the amount of \$51,500.00

Based on the bids submitted, we suggest award of the Base Bid of Contract No. 24-PW1 - Public Works Operations Building Solar Panels to EIS as low bidder in the amount of \$70,700.00, subject to EIS obtaining the required insurance certificates, performance bond, and payment bond, and review and approval of same by the Borough Solicitor prior to execution of the Agreement by the Borough.

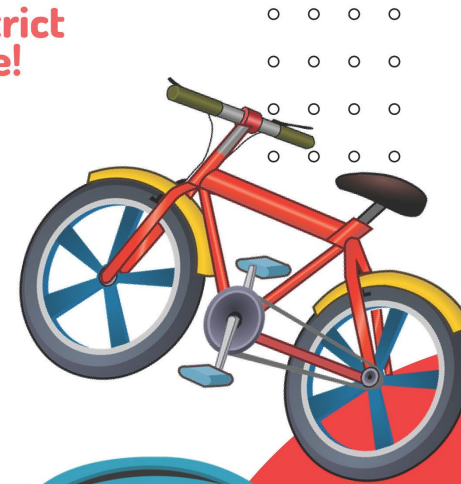

*LSSE provided Bid Report via letter dated March 19, 2024. For Fox Chapel Borough's portion of the Contract; based on discussion with the Borough, LSSE recommended the award of the Base Bid, and Add Alternate Nos. F-A1, F-A5, F-A6, F-A7, F-A8 of Contract No. 24-R01 – 2024 Roadway Improvement Program to Youngblood Paving, Inc. in the total amount of \$1,675,133.03. Please note that this amount includes \$59,162.35 to be reimbursed by Peoples Natural Gas for cost sharing of F-A6 Hemlock Hollow Road (Dorseyville to Old Mill), \$16,872.50 for Utility Patches which will be reimbursed by respective utility companies, and \$95,076.25 for F-A7 FCA Utility Repairs to be paid directly by Fox Chapel Authority. Therefore, total to be paid out of the Road Paving Budget will be \$1,504,021.93. **LSSE issued award letter dated April 12, 2024. LSSE transmitted contract documents to the Borough on April 30, 2024. Pre-Construction Meeting letter was issued April 30, 2024 and corresponding meeting was held in conjunction with O'Hara Township, Sharpsburg Borough, Fox Chapel Authority, and Youngblood Paving, Inc. on May 1, 2024. LSSE issued PNG Hemlock Hollow Restoration OPC letter dated May 1, 2024. Contractor anticipates mobilization week of May 20, 2024. LSSE transmitted fully executed Notice to Proceed to the Borough on May 7, 2024.***

3. Hardie Valley Park Storm Water Conceptual Planning: *Presentation to Parks Committee was held April 10, 2023. LSSE confirmed process with dam safety and PaDEP has indicated that the Borough will be required to mitigate any impacts to the stream including inundation by the impoundment. LSSE to submit permits for stormwater improvements once sanitary sewer relocation permit is issued and work is underway. **LSSE coordinating permit documents with the Landscape Architect.***

4. McCahill Park Improvements: *The stormwater management facilities have been sized to release the 500-year storm event at 80% of the pre-developed conditions. LSSE submitted NPDES Permit application package to Allegheny County Conservation District, and submitted Chapter 105 Water Obstruction and Encroachment Permit Registration Package to PaDEP on June 9, 2023. LSSE submitted responses to the ACCD NPDES and PaDEP Chapter 105/106 Permit application review comments on September 2, 2023. ACCD issued the NPDES completeness review on September 28, 2023, and is now completing the technical review. PADEP issued the Chapter 105 Completeness Review on November 13, 2023 and is completing the technical review. PaDEP provided comment on the NPDES Permit application on December 14, 2023. LSSE submitted a response on January 12, 2024. PaDEP issued NPDES Permit on April 9, 2024, permit expires April 3, 2029. **PaDEP issued comments on Chapter 105 on March 27, 2024, LSSE submitted a response to corresponding comments on April 12, 2024.***

5. Fox Chapel Road and Field Club Road: *LSSE transmitted Intersection Control Assessment on August 1, 2022. LSSE completed field surveys for Green Light Go Grant project in November. Design drawings are 60% complete. LSSE has coordination meeting with PennDOT the week of January 15, 2024 to verify items. Anticipate review of draft plans over the next 30 days. LSSE met with Borough Staff to review draft plans. LSSE proceeding with design in anticipation of late spring bid. Plans are being updated based on review with Borough Staff. Project is anticipated for bid opening in May 2024. LSSE provided a revised plan to the Borough on March 27, 2024. LSSE revised the plan per Borough comments. PennDOT comments were received on April 2, 2024, LSSE is preparing the plan for resubmission.*
6. Guyasuta Road and Fieldvue Lane Sight Distance: *LSSE transmitted Sight Distance Memo on March 12, 2024 for Borough review.*

Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)

1. *PaDEP issued permit on November 18, 2018. PaDEP Inspection held on February 4, 2020. 2022 Annual Progress Report has been submitted. Testing results issued on January 5, 2023. LSSE uploaded Permit Renewal to DEP on February 6, 2023. Outfall screening to begin in June 2023. Outfall screening has been completed; LSSE issued summary memo. LSSE has drafted progress report and will review with Borough Staff in coming weeks. LSSE transmitted Annual MS4 Status Report to PaDEP on September 27, 2023.*
2. **PRP Plan:**
 - A. **Stream Restoration (Hemlock Hollow Road):** *Permit has been issued. LSSE assisted the Borough in planting schedule. Borough has completed work on Phase I.*
 - B. **Current PRP Status:** *LSSE issued memo dated May 15, 2023 outlining current status of pollutant reduction plans, and subsequent projects to be completed for Borough compliance to MS4 Permit requirements. Borough is working on final plantings for stream restoration projects.*

Sanitary Sewers

- LSSE working on Engineering Services relating to the ACO:
- **Phase I COA / O&M:** *Feasibility Study was submitted to the Health Department prior to July 31, 2013 deadline. LSSE transmitted the Source Flow Reduction Study Report on November 30, 2017. Borough to continue Operation and Maintenance Plan and efforts to remove extraneous water that enters the sanitary sewers. The 2021 CCTV and lining work has been completed. The 2022 CCTV and lining work has been completed. The 2023 Lining Program has been established with the Sewer Supervisor. A Letter of Interest (LOI) for this program was submitted to ALCOSAN for potential GROW Grant funding on March 31, 2023. Fox Chapel received invitation to submit a GROW application. Completed application was submitted to the ALCOSAN on June 28, 2023. This project was not approved for funding. 2024 O&M CCTV scope finalized, and generally includes 20,000 linear feet of CCTV tributary to Guyasuta Run (ALCOSAN POCA-74A). The 2024 O&M lining scope reviewed with Borough, and generally includes sanitary sewer lining along Hemlock Hollow Road and Old Mill Road. Lining completed in 2023 and planned lining for 2024 was combined into one GROW Grant LOI that was submitted to ALCOSAN on March 28, 2024. **ALCOSAN has accepted the GROW LOI and***

has invited Fox Chapel to submit a grant application by June 30, 2024. LSSE has initiated drafting the application.

- **Phase II COA:** *The Phase II COA was released by ACHD on September 1, 2021. The initial task is the Exhibit 'B' Base Line Due Diligence period, which is due six-months after execution. The Phase II COA BDD Report was submitted to ACHD on July 29, 2022. Remaining tasks for this Order include continued sanitary sewer O&M as well as the continued implementation of the time-of-sale lateral inspection ordinance.*
- **Sycamore Run Flow Monitor:** *Data collection ongoing and will be for life of system. LSSE preparing quarterly flow data reports. Meter service and recalibration completed October 7, 2022. Data collection ongoing. LSSE evaluating alternatives for remote data access. Data collection issues were identified in September 2023 caused by storm event / power outages that occurred previously. LSSE field technicians are working with Advanced Instruments to replace and reprogram the data storage device. Meter has been sent to ISCO for refurbishment. ISCO has provided and installed a temporary meter. Potential options moving forward include meter refurbishment, meter replacement, or a differing meter technology. This decision will depend on the pending ISCO quote for meter refurbishment. **Borough to make determination on meter replacement.***
- **Other Flow Monitor Installations:** *Flow monitors are currently installed at the Ottawa Hills and Fairview POCs (installed June 21, 2022). Data collection ongoing. LSSE to set up flow data review meeting with Borough to determine next steps. LSSE received DCDBA 2023 flow monitoring data. A memo summarizing flow data collected in 2023 has been drafted. To be reviewed with the Borough in February 2024. LSSE issued 2023 Flow Data Review Memo dated February 28, 2024.*
- **Interceptor H&H Model Update:** *A Service Order Authorization (SOA) was submitted to the Borough on February 22, 2023 related to updating the hydrologic and hydraulic (H&H) model and sanitary sewer alternatives analysis based on contemporary flow data collected over the past 10 years. Flow data analysis has been initiated. Recalibration and alternatives analysis are complete.*
- **ALCOSAN Regionalization:** *Interceptor takeover review ongoing in Allegheny County. ALCOSAN considering taking over certain interceptor sewers in the County, approximately 185 miles is being discussed. Meeting with ALCOSAN /AECOM held on Friday, July 7, 2015 to discuss regionalization discussion for multi-municipal sewers. ALCOSAN held a series of regionalization outreach meetings, the last week in September 2018. ALCOSAN hosted a meeting in regards to Regionalization and GROW Grants on October 27, 2021. Issues with the modified transfer agreement were discussed. Potential next step would be to focus on Guyasuta Interceptor agreement first if conflicts regarding park property can be resolved. ALCOSAN met with LSSE to review status of all LSSE clients' interceptor takeovers and provided most recent packet of information for each that has been provided to the Boroughs and Townships. ALCOSAN is aware of the*

Borough's concerns with the agreement. A meeting to be scheduled to update status with the Solicitor and Borough Staff and then with Council in the summer months. No Change.

- **Shady Lane / Delafield Stream Removal Project:** *The Army Corp is taking the lead on the project. ALCOSAN and the Army Corp recently executed an agreement to move this project to the design phase. This agreement arranged for ALCOSAN to use a portion of their 25% project match to fund design costs. Future discussions will need to take place regarding municipal agreements before moving forward to the construction phase. An A/E Firm was selected but the fees requested were over the amount budgeted. Additional funding is needed to move forward per ALCOSAN. Project design firm to be selected. A project update meeting with ALCOSAN and the Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) was held in June 2023. The project is now being considered a separation project. 30% Design Drawings from USACE were provided by ALCOSAN on July 24, 2023.*
- **Old Mill Road Sanitary Sewer Replacement:** *LSSE transmitted application fee payment for WQM Part II Permit on November 8, 2023. PaDEP issued the Chapter 105 General Permit on November 11, 2023. PADEP reported WQM Part II Permit under review on December 13, 2023. PaDEP issued the WQM Part II Permit (No. 0290405), on February 27, 2024. **Public Works in process of installing sanitary sewer.***
- **Upper Allegheny Near Surface Facilities Package 6 Project:** *This project includes the design of a consolidation sewer between A-78 and A-72 to tie into the future ALCOSAN Allegheny River Tunnel project, which is a major component of ALCOSAN's Clean Water Plan. Technical meeting with tributary communities to be held March 18, 2024. **LSSE to provide Sycamore Run flow data to ALCOSAN.***
- **2024 Sanitary Sewer Repairs:** **LSSE to prepare PADEP General Permit No. 5 for the repair of sanitary sewers along four streams within the Borough. Once the Borough provides the final locations, LSSE will schedule performing the topographic surveys.**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF FOX CHAPEL, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH TO ENTER INTO AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE BOROUGH OF ASPINWALL TO CONTRIBUTE BOROUGH FUNDS TO FOXWALL EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF A NEW AMBULANCE AND TO ESTABLISH THE REPAYMENT TERMS FOR A \$64,400 LOAN TO THE BOROUGH OF ASPINWALL BY THE BOROUGH OF FOX CHAPEL.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 53 Pa. C.S.A. §2301 et. seq., and Section 1202(24) of the Pennsylvania Borough Code, 8 Pa.C.S. § 1202(24), as amended, the Borough of Fox Chapel is authorized to enter into cooperation agreements with other local governments for the performance or exercise of governmental functions, powers, and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Aspinwall and the Borough Council of the Borough of Fox Chapel desire to enter into an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement to contribute Borough funds to Foxwall Emergency Medical Service, Inc. (“Foxwall”) for the purchase of a new ambulance and to establish the repayment terms for a \$64,400 loan to the Borough of Aspinwall by Fox Chapel Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to execute an agreement which, among other things, sets forth the terms, conditions, and each municipality’s contribution related to the purchase of a new Ambulance and the interest rate and other repayment terms of the loan to Aspinwall from Fox Chapel; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Fox Chapel is willing to enter into such an agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Borough Council of the Borough of Fox Chapel, Pennsylvania, hereby resolves as follows, incorporating the above recitals by reference:

Section 1. The Borough Council of the Borough of Fox Chapel hereby approves the Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement in a form acceptable to the Borough Solicitor and Borough Manager, substantially similar to the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit “A”.

Section 2. Pursuant to the requirements of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, the terms of the Agreement and this Resolution set forth: (1) the conditions of agreement for the cooperation of the Borough of Aspinwall and the Borough of Fox

Chapel for the monetary contribution to Foxwall for the purchase of a new ambulance, and a loan to Aspinwall from Fox Chapel in the amount of \$64,400 at 0% interest to be repaid on or before March 31, 2025; (2) the duration of the term of the Agreement; (3) the purposes and objectives of the Agreement, including the powers and scope of authority delegated in the Agreement and; (4) the manner and extent of financing the Agreement. Because of the nature of this intergovernmental cooperation agreement, §§2307(5), (6) and (7) of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act do not apply.

Section 3. The appropriate Borough of Fox Chapel officials are hereby authorized to execute the Agreement that is the subject of this Resolution and to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the same.

Section 4. Should any sentence, section, clause, part, or provision of this Resolution be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Resolution as a whole other than the part declared to be invalid.

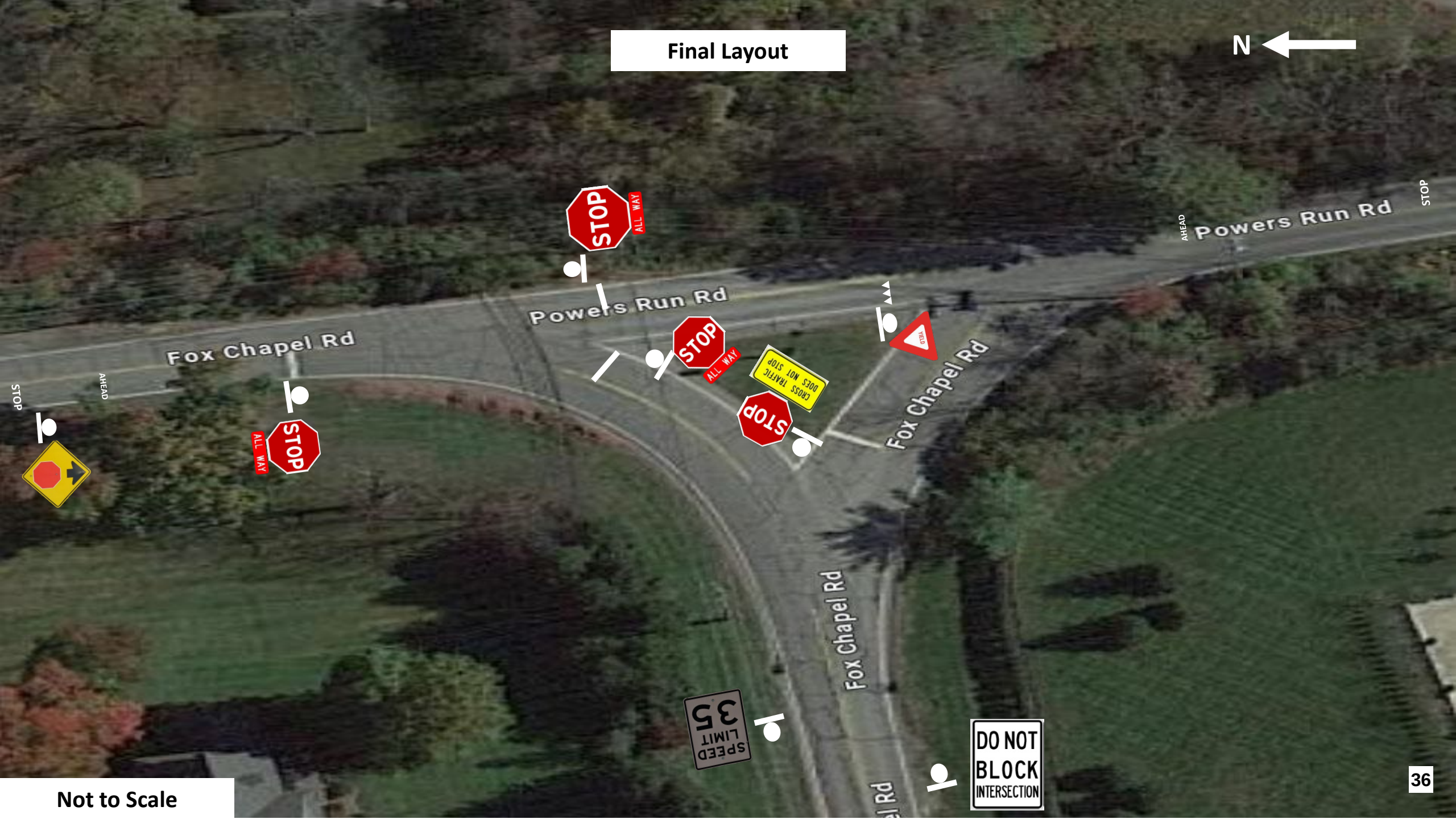

ORDINANCE NO. 730**

**AN AMENDED AND RESTATED ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF FOX CHAPEL SETTING
ALLEGHENY VALLEY JOINT SEWAGE AUTHORITY (AVJSA) RATES AND RESTATING BOROUGH,
HARMAR, AND ALCOSAN SEWAGE RATES**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Fox Chapel imposes certain sewer rates to maintain the sewer infrastructure in the Borough, and

WHEREAS, such sewer rates were last increased on May 15, 2023, and it is desired to restate such rates; and

WHEREAS, certain other sewer rates are imposed by the Borough of Fox Chapel to compensate for charges imposed by the Allegheny Valley Joint Sewage Authority (AVJSA); and

WHEREAS, it is desired to provide for said increased rates and charges; and

WHEREAS, it is also desired to restate the rates imposed by the Borough of Fox Chapel to compensate for charges imposed by Harmar Township, Allegheny County Sanitary Authority (ALCOSAN), and the Borough of Fox Chapel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Fox Chapel, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania. It is hereby ordained and enacted by virtue of the same:

SECTION 1.

A. Fox Chapel Borough Sewers

Section 51. Imposition of Charges. Beginning on January 1, 2014, there are hereby imposed sewer rentals or charges for the use of the Borough sewers to be payable by the owners or occupants of all properties served thereby.

Section 52. Sewer Rental Schedule. In order to apportion such sewer rentals or charges equitably among the several properties served by the Borough sewers, the following schedule of sewer rentals or charges based upon the most recent available water meter reading is hereby adopted:

- (a) \$4.66 per 1,000 gallons plus a Customer Service Line Charge of \$15 per quarter per account for operations and \$45 per quarter per equivalent dwelling unit (EDU), equal to 350 gallons per day, for the Squaw Run Interceptor Project.

Section 53. Calculation of Quantity of Water Used; Use of Approved Water Meter

Authorized. The quantity of water used by water users other than those referred to in Section 52, Subsection (a), shall be estimated by the Borough at 25,000 gallons per quarter, and such water users' sewage charges shall be calculated by applying the schedule of rates set forth in Section 52, Subsection (a), to the aforesaid estimated quantity. In the event such a water user desires, he may, at no expense to the Borough, install and maintain a water meter approved by the representative of the Borough authorized for the purpose. In addition, the Borough, in its sole discretion, shall have the right to require that an approved water meter be installed to measure water usage by each separate user. Included in this shall be the right of the Borough to require separate water meters for each of multiple users occupying separate premises on the same property (for example, the landlord and a tenant). The sewage charges shall then be calculated upon actual water consumption recorded on this meter. Nothing in this Section shall prevent the Borough from collecting charges from either landlord or tenant, as and to the extent permitted by law.

Section 54. Additional Water Meter May Be Installed at the Expense of the Property

Owner. The owner of any property subject hereto may install and maintain, at no expense to the Borough of Fox Chapel, a water meter approved by the representative of the Borough authorized to measure the water used for lawn care and other purposes so that such water does not enter the sanitary sewer system. In such a case, the charges imposed hereby will be based upon the water consumption indicated by the difference between the reading on the main water meter and the reading on the secondary water meter located on such property.

Section 55. Authorization to Install Sewage Meter. With the prior written approval of the representative of the Borough authorized for the purpose, the owner of any property subject hereto may install a sewage meter, in which event the sewer rentals or charges hereby imposed will be based upon the quantity of sewage so metered.

Section 56. Billing Schedule; When Payable, Penalty and Interest Added to Delinquent

Bills. Bills for sewer rentals or charges imposed by this ordinance shall be rendered quarterly by the representative so designated by the Borough on the basis of the most recent quarterly water meter reading or estimate. All sewage charges billed shall be payable within twenty (20) days after the bill is rendered. If the bill remains unpaid after twenty (20) days from the billing date, a penalty of 5% shall be paid plus interest on the overdue bills at the rate of .5% per month or part thereof upon 105% of the sewage charge, which interest shall begin on the sixtieth (60th) day after the due date.

Section 57. Unpaid Sewer Rentals and Charges Constitute Lien; Collection. Any sewer rental or charge not paid within thirty (30) days from the billing date shall be a lien upon the property charged with the payment thereof from the first day of the following month. Such sewer rentals or charges, if not paid after thirty (30) days' notice, may be collected as provided by law, by an action in assumpsit, or by distress of personal property on the premises, or by lien filed in the nature of a municipal lien, or by requesting and directing the Fox Chapel Authority to shut off, after compliance with the General Municipal Law,

particularly 53 P.S. § 2261, the supply of water to said premises until all such rentals and charges, together with any penalties and interest thereon, shall be paid.

Section 58. Access to Premises Served by Water Meters or Sewage Meters. The Borough, through its authorized representatives, shall be permitted to enter all properties serviced by water meters or sewage meters for the purpose of inspection, observation, measurements, and testing. No owner or occupant may perform any grading, construction, or other work which has the effect of (a) burying or making inaccessible any water meter, sewage meter, meter pit, manhole, or other elements of the water or sewage system, (b) causing stormwater or surface water to drain into or to collect upon or around any such water meter, sewage meter, meter pit, manhole or other elements, or (c) placing fill or overburden upon any water or sewer line or pipe so as to overload or otherwise compromise such line or pipe. In the event an owner or occupant performs such work and fails or refuses to remove or correct it after notice from the Borough, the Borough may perform the removal or correction work for the account of the owner or occupant and may recover its direct and indirect costs (including customary overhead) of such work from the owner or occupant by any available legal means, including but not limited to placing a municipal lien against the property upon which the Borough performs such work.

B. Sewers Entering Allegheny County Sanitary Authority Systems

Section 101. ALCOSAN Charges Established. The charges of the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority (ALCOSAN) for sewage service to properties located in the Borough of Fox Chapel, the sewage from which enters the sewer system of ALCOSAN, shall be added to the sewage charges imposed by the Borough as previously set forth and are as follows:

- (a) Metered Water Users. The following schedule of rates shall be applicable to users of metered water during the time periods listed below. Charges shall be based upon the quantity of water delivered to each water user as measured by the most recent available water meter reading:

<u>Time Periods</u>	<u>Sewage Charges for Water Used Per Quarter Year</u>
January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024	\$11.14 per 1,000 gallons plus a Customer Service Charge of \$23.41 per bill
January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2025	\$11.92 per 1,000 gallons plus a Customer Service Charge of \$25.05 per bill
January 1, 2026, through December 31, 2026	\$12.76 per 1,000 gallons plus a Customer Service Charge of \$26.80 per bill

- (b) Flat Rate Water Users. The following schedule of rates shall be applicable to water users whose water bills are based upon a flat rate as distinguished from those whose water bills are based on meter readings. All flat-rate water residential customers will be billed upon an equivalent residential unit base ("ERU"). The average residential usage becomes the basis on which flat-rate residential water

users are charged. The average residential usage is estimated at 20,000 gallons per quarter. Each residential flat-rate account will be billed for sewer services based upon this average and the schedule of rates set forth in Subsection (a) above unless proof is provided that the customer's usage is more or less.

- (c) Other Water Users. The quantity of water used by water users other than those referred to in Subsections (a) and (b) above shall be estimated by ALCOSAN, and each such water user's sewage charge shall be calculated by applying the schedule of rates set forth in Subsection (a) above to the estimated quantity.

Section 102. Surcharges Applicable to High-Strength Sewage Discharges. In any case, in which a discharger's wastes have an unusually high concentration of suspended solids and/or biochemical oxygen demand, the sewage charges calculated as hereinbefore set forth shall be increased according to the following formulae:

- (a) Suspended Solids Charge Calculation

(S.S. minus 275) times .008345 times \$0.2464 times consumption (1,000 gallons)

Where:

S.S. = Suspended solids of particular wastes in milligrams per liter (mg/L)

.008345 = Conversion factor from mg/L to pounds per 1,000 gallons

\$0.2464 = Treatment cost per pound of suspended solids

- (b) Biochemical Oxygen Demand Calculation

(BOD - 300) times .008345 times \$0.2184 times consumption (1,000 gallons)

Where:

BOD = Biochemical oxygen demand of particular wastes in milligrams per Liter (mg/L)

.008345 = Conversion factor from mg/L to pounds per 1,000 gallons

\$0.2184 = Treatment costs per pound of biochemical oxygen demand

Section 103. Additional Charges for Commercial Garbage Disposals. For each commercial (i.e., non-residential) garbage disposal, ALCOSAN shall charge users as follows:

\$172.37 times the horsepower capacity of garbage disposal per quarter

Section 104. Rate of Discharge of Construction Site Groundwater.

The following rates will apply to the temporary discharge of accumulated groundwater from construction excavation sites provided that:

- (a) The need to discharge to the sewage collection system will not exceed nine (9) months, and

- (b) No toxic pollutant listed in the ALCOSAN Pretreatment Regulations is present in untreated groundwater above detection limits established for USEPA-approved analytical methods for such pollutants; and
- (c) The concentration of suspended solids in the discharged water is less than 135 mg/1, and the concentration of biochemical oxygen demand is less than 150 mg/1; and
- (d) ALCOSAN has determined in its judgment (which shall be final and absolute) that reasonable efforts have been made to obtain a permit from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to discharge such groundwater to the nearest waterway and that the application for such permit has been denied or that discharge under such permit is not feasible.

A fee equal to one-half (1/2) of the existing charge per 1,000 gallons shall be charged for each pump used for the purpose of discharging groundwater and shall be based upon the pumping capacity of each pump used, in thousand gallons per day (kgd). This fee shall be applied daily for each day pumping occurs.

Section 105. Certain Water Excluded in Calculating Charges. The quantity of water which does not reach a metered water user's sewer, if separately metered, will not be included in the quantity upon which the sewage charge is calculated.

Section 106. Authorization to Install Sewage Meter. With the prior written approval of ALCOSAN, a non-residential water user may install a sewage meter in which event the sewage charges will be based upon the quantity of sewage so metered. For the reading of the sewage meter and the account maintenance required to bill based on such meter, a charge per meter will be made according to the Unit Cost for Auxiliary Meters.

Section 107. Use of Well Water in Addition to Public Water. For accounts that use well water in addition to public water and where the well water is metered, the metered well usage will be added to the public water usage to produce the sewage charge. For the reading of the well water meter and the account maintenance required to bill based on such meter, a charge per meter will be made according to the Unit Cost for Auxiliary Meters.

Section 108. Unit Cost for Auxiliary Meters. The Unit Cost for Auxiliary Meters is \$110.00 per year.

C. Sewers Entering Allegheny Valley Joint Sewage Authority ("AVJSA")

Section 125. Harmar/AVJSA Charges Established. The charges of Harmar Township and the Allegheny Valley Joint Sewage Authority for sewage service to properties located in the Borough of Fox Chapel, the sewage from which enters the sewer system of Harmar Township with treatment facilities owned and operated by the Allegheny Valley Joint Sewage Authority, shall be added to the sewage charges imposed by the Borough of Fox

Chapel as previously set forth in Section 52 and are as follows for bills rendered beginning May 1, 2024.

(a) Metered Water Users:

\$3.00/Qtr.

AVJSA
\$12.20/1,000 Gal.

D. Effective Date

Section 150. Section 125 takes effect on May 1, 2024. The remainder of this Ordinance takes effect upon enactment and approval.

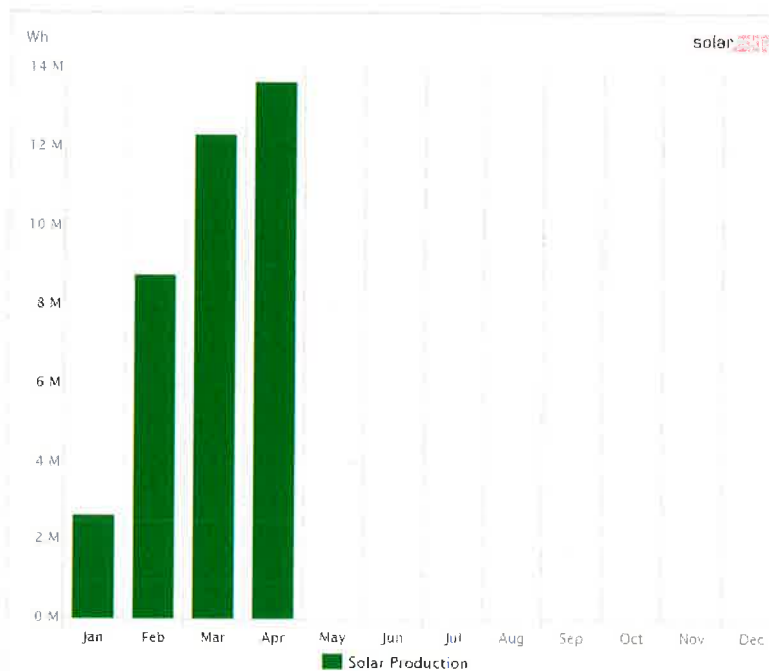

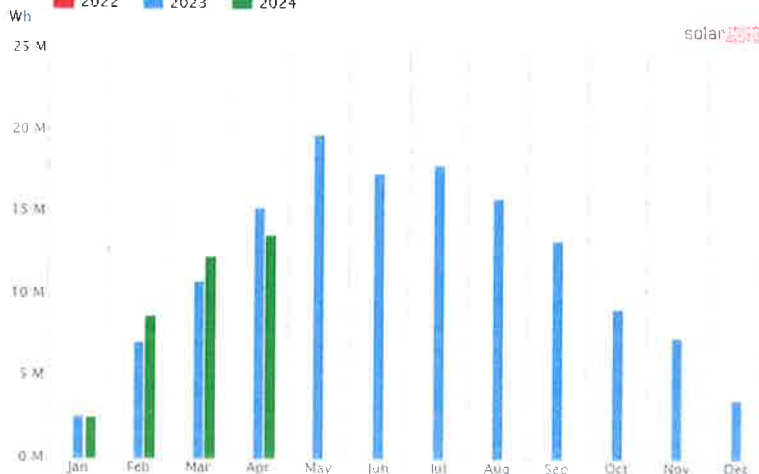
